



Objective Standards for Eligibility of Camp Scholarship Recipient

The following guidelines qualify a scholarship candidate at Camp Regis Applejack. Financial information is submitted as part of the camp scholarship application process. Characteristics are determined by interviews with scholarship candidates and those with first-hand knowledge of the candidates such as teachers.

- Camper is self-motivated and excited to participate under the guidelines of Camp Regis Applejack.
- Camper is 6 to 16 years old.
- Camper expresses curiosity, integrity, intelligence, and willingness to take risks.
- Camper is flexible and mature.
- Camper is involved in school and extracurricular activities.
- Camper is respectful of others and able to follow the guidelines of positive group dynamics.
- Camper is able to work with the physical demands of the program.
- Camper is interested in grasping a broader sense of responsibility and a larger understanding of the physical world, and is interested in acquiring greater self-confidence, know-how, and leadership skills.
- Camper is committed to being a positive contributing group member and shows a genuine interest in participating, understanding that his or her commitment means full participation and completion of the program.
- Camper has a family who supports this child's attendance at Camp Regis Applejack.
- Camper's family is unable to otherwise afford sending this child to attend camp as shown by their submission of income and expense information on the camp scholarship application.
- The amount given toward the participation of any scholarship camper shall not exceed the amount of tuition and airfare minus the amount the family is able to pay and any amount gleaned from the participant's own efforts in raising funds.
